Jeannie's rendition of "**Democracy**" by Leonard Cohen speaks directly to this. She says: "When this country was first founded, we called it a Democracy, yet only white men who owned land could vote. It took a lot of time, effort and civil disobedience to bring us this far. Susan B. Anthony, Alice Paul, Rosa Parks and union organizers were all arrested in their efforts to bring us closer to this ideal. In this time when our Democracy is being eroded, this song brings an optimistic call to action."
